Overview:

With over 80 years of history, NCCU is one of the most prestigious institutions in Taiwan. Our educational goal is to give our students international perspectives, excellent problem solving skills, and solid managerial capabilities with a firm understanding of Asia Pacific business dynamics. By creating a global perspective through recruiting a diverse cross section of qualified candidates, the IMBA intends to assist students in their endeavor to integrate a meaningful balance between business theory and practical application of skills and abilities to their careers.

Terms & Dates:

- Summer: three-week intensive courses in July totaling 36 contact hours each (limited offerings)
- Fall: mid-Sept to mid-Dec
- Winter: schedule does not align with UW calendar

NCCU requires exchange students to take a minimum of 9 credits and a maximum of 30. Students must transfer an equivalent minimum of 10 UW credits to maintain good academic standing.

Students may take courses from any of the NCCU master's programs. Electives within the IMBA: International MBA Program (<http://imba.nccu.edu.tw>) fall under four areas of concentration: International Business; Marketing; Finance; and Management in Asia.

Housing:

NCCU provides dormitory and off campus housing services. International students are given first priority. Applications to accommodations must be made at least 2 months prior to arriving. There are no co-ed dormitories at NCCU. Graduate students are housed in single or double rooms.

Scholarships:

NCCU offers a limited number of scholarships for free on-campus accommodation and for Mandarin Chinese language lessons. Inquire with NCCU's exchange program coordinator.

Career Services:

Inquire with host school about availability of Career Services to exchange students.

Exchange Office Services:

All exchange partners offer course registration assistance, transcripts, orientations, and paperwork necessary to obtain a student visa. Orientations are held for in-bound students in the fall. NCCU will provide details to accepted students.

A visa is required to enter Taiwan. NCCU will provide the documentation needed to apply for the visa. Proof of adequate health insurance is required of all students.
