2017 FOSTER GRADUATION CELEBRATION FAQs

Does the Business School plan any events for graduating seniors?

Yes, the Foster School is planning a graduation celebration on Sunday, June 4, 2017, at 3:00pm. Graduates can register to attend online: <http://foster.uw.edu/academics/graduation>

So, is this a Foster School 'Graduation Ceremony'?

No, it is not. There will be a processional, faculty will be present, and students will walk across the stage while their names are read. But, there will be no diplomas handed out, and degrees will not be conferred. The celebration is an opportunity for Foster to give individual recognition to each of its graduates.

How do I meet eligibility requirements for the 2017 Foster Graduation Celebration?

Students who earned a degree in Summer 2016, Autumn 2016, or Winter 2017, or have applied to graduate with a departmental advisor for Spring 2017 or Summer 2017 are eligible. Make sure you apply to graduate by April 14 to guarantee your name is printed in the Foster program. Note: *Summer graduates may choose to participate either before or following their August graduation date. If they choose the June before, they must apply to graduate by the third week of spring quarter, but their names will not be listed in the program until the following year. When will degrees be conferred?

Degrees for all UW graduates from the 2016-2017 school year will be conferred at the UW Commencement Exercises on Saturday, June 10, 2017. For more information about UW Commencement, www.uw.edu/graduation

Do I have to wear a cap and gown to the Foster School's Celebration?

What else happens at the celebration?

The Associate Dean for Undergraduate Programs and the Dean of the Business School will make remarks. There will be a keynote speaker and a student speaker. The celebration is also a great time to introduce your friends and family to the business students, faculty and staff that you've gotten to know over the years.

Do graduates need to arrive early?

Yes, graduates need to arrive no later than 2:30pm.

How many people can I invite; do I need tickets?

At this time we are not limiting the number of people you can invite and you do not need tickets to attend. *You must RSVP online before May 26, 2017.*

I, or one of my guests, have special needs (special seating, sign language interpreter, etc). How do I request accommodations?

Is there parking?

Yes, parking is available on campus. Parking rates \$14 pre-paid and \$15 day of. You will be able to pre-purchase parking passes online using the form to purchase cap and gown, parking permits, and other graduation items. The form will be available in early May. You will provide your contact info on the back of your name card so that GradImages can send you your photo proofs in the mail or electronically.

Of course, you are welcome to attend both events! These events are meant to be complementary and not mutually exclusive.
