### **Course Description**

Professional development (Pro Dev) encompasses a broad range of concepts and skills. Pro Dev integrates theoretical knowledge with practice and brings in Foster MBA Career Management consultants/staff and business leaders to teach students about career development topics, skills, and competencies necessary to be successful. This course will enable students to acquire new skills necessary to be successful. The focus of this class is on transition from school to work and navigating personal and professional career goals to achieve career success.

The concentration of professional development is required for graduation. Class attendance, participation, and satisfactory completion of assignments, are all required to meet the requirements for completing this course. Students must complete six full days of Pro Dev during early fall sessions plus requirements for completing assignments. Following the early fall workshops, there are two fall quarter workshops during the core hours that must be attended to receive a certificate of completion. This certificate can be noted on their resume and most importantly satisfies the requirement for graduation.

Pro Dev and the online career management summer course prepares MBA students for the rigorous MBA job search and recruiting both on-campus and off-campus. This course is about helping students know their work and world views, MBA recruiting, finding a job, and getting an offer. It is about both design, strategy and execution.

MBA recruiting and talent acquisition requires candidates to perform well in networking and interviewing. This rigor applies broadly across industries and job functions. Pro Dev creates an opportunity to focus on much needed job search skills for winter and spring internship recruiting. The Leadership and Career Plan should be used and updated throughout the two year academic experience.

This course is composed of a series of workshops focused on the nuts and bolts of professional development and job search competencies for MBA students. Sessions cover topics that promote success such as developing a professional brand, design thinking careers, networking, writing, making powerful presentations, and interviewing.

#### Learning objectives for Pro Dev are:

- Take ownership of your career development
- Discover strengths, personal brand, and traits which differentiate a Foster MBA candidate in the market
- Understand how to use MBA Career Management, other school resources, and networks of supporters
- Reflect on career choices, personal desires, and goals
- Learn how to network, cold call, and use appropriate etiquette at business functions
- Understand the expectations of employers for networking and business etiquette
- Achieve competency in behavioral and case interviewing
- Know the best use of online job search tools such as LinkedIn, GradLeaders, Vault and Foster Jobs
- Interact with industry leaders

#### Learning will be through the following methods:

- MBA Career Management staff and guest speakers and experts in the field of recruiting, talent acquisition, and interviewing will provide frameworks, theories, and real-life examples.
- Speakers will represent local and national businesses and represent wellknown trainers in their fields.
