FOSTER SCHOOL OF BUSINESS UNDERGRADUATE EXCHANGE 2019–20 FACTSHEET

SEATTLE, WASHINGTON, USA

The Michael G. Foster School of Business at the University of Washington is located in beautiful Seattle, Washington USA. Seattle lies in the Northwest corner of the continental United States and is an idyllic location surrounded by both mountains and water. Seattle is home to many iconic companies including Starbucks, Amazon, Boeing, and many others, making it an ideal place to study business.

STUDY PROGRAM

COURSES

Students must attend the UW on a full-time basis. A full-time course load is 12-18 UW credits per quarter. 18 credits is the maximum. Quarters run for 10 weeks each. Incoming exchange students typically take three or four 100- to 400-level courses with each course carrying 4 UW credits.

Exchange students are responsible for ensuring that the credits they receive will transfer back to their home institution. Demand and space constraints make Finance and Accounting courses difficult to get into. Foster School incoming exchange students are allowed to take non-business coursework.

COURSE DESCRITIONS & TIME SCHEDULE

LEARNING EXPECTATIONS

Class formats include lecture and discussion, in-class presentations and case studies. Grading is based on papers, group projects, case studies, class participation and exams. Exam formats may vary. Typically exams are held during the final week of the quarter.

LENGTH OF CLASS

A typical upper-division 4-credit business course runs 2 days per week, for 2 hours per day, for a total of 4 hours of class time each week or 40 hours of classtime during a quarter. Courses usually run either Monday and Wednesday, or Tuesday and Thursday anytime from 7:30 a.m. until 9:30 p.m. Courses outside the Foster School may be offered on different schedules.

REQUIREMENTS

- -Proof of English proficiency is required. This can be demostrated with a minimum TOEFL Internet score of 83, or IELTS score of 7.
- -Be enrolled at a partner school at the 3rd or 4th year level.

APPLICATION DOCUMENTS

Nominations by students' home university are sent to Theresa Maloney (tmaloney@uw.edu). After being nominated, students will receive an email from Theresa with instructions to submit application materials online.

Students will upload the following:

- Copy of passport identification page
- Official bank letter or bank statement indicating sufficient funds balance
- All college transcripts, translated into English
- TOEFL (IBT): 83 or IELTS: 7 score report (Not required for passport holders of English speaking countries)

LIFE ON CAMPUS

While in Seattle, students who are participating in the Foster School of Business undergraduate exchange program have the opportunity to integrate themselves into student life in a variety of ways. Many exchange students participate in extracurricular activities, such as student clubs, case competitions, or intermural sports teams. Student services include: Email Accounts, Sports Facilities, Advisors, Organized Trips, Social Activities, and Foster School Ambassador (buddy).

ACCOMMODATIONS

Students have the option of registering for on-campus housing. This is not guaranteed and is assigned on a first come, first serve basis. The cost ranges from \$2,189 - \$5,332 per quarter.
