## **ARRIVAL AND SERVICES** (FURTHER INFORMATION AND SERVICES MAY BE FOUND IN OUR CENTRAL INTERNATIONAL OFFICE'S FACT SHEET)

Arrival	We request that students arrive at least one week before the start of lectures in order to enroll and attend the Welcome Week.
Orientation	<u>Mandatory</u> orientation sessions take place during the Welcome Week. There will be an orientation session held by the Central International Office (general orientation) and a welcome and information session held by the Business School.
Buddy Program	Exchange students can opt to be matched with a Mannheim student (organized by our student initiative VISUM).
Services	Exchange students can access the same facilities as regular degree-seeking students, such as libraries, computer centers, sports facilities and cafeterias.

## COURSES

Information on courses	The University's course catalogue for exchange students can be found here: https://www.uni-mannheim.de/en/academics/coming-to-mannheim/exchange- students/courses/course-catalog/. Business exchange students may also take courses offered by the other schools (restrictions might apply), but are required to take the majority of their courses at the Business School.
Course selection	As a general rule, Bachelor/undergraduate students must take Bachelor level courses. Only Master/graduate students and Bachelor students who are in their 4 <sup>th</sup> year of studies may take Master level courses from our M.Sc. program (Mannheim Master in Management).
Course load	There is no official limit, but we recommend not taking more than the equivalent of 30 ECTS (credit points) per semester (full semester work load).
Course registration	Course registration varies, but if, by when and how students need to register will be stated clearly in the course description.
Language	At the Business School, the majority of our courses are taught in English. Some courses are taught in German.
German language courses	Four-week intensive German language courses are offered in January and in August (special rates for exchange students). The German language courses offered during the semester are free apart from a registration fee of EUR 15 per course. Each exchange student can take up to 3 courses per semester. There is an online registration before/at the beginning of lectures.
