Overview:

Shanghai Jiao Tong University was founded in 1896 by Mr. SHENG Xuanhuai. It is one of the oldest universities in China. Founded in 1918, The School of Management is one of the first business schools in China. In 2006 the business school was named Antai College of Economics and Management. The college consists of 30-odd academic institutes. There are over 1,300 MBA students in the college. Education quality of the school ranks among the top in the field of management among universities across China. The college was twice awarded the first prize in “Overall Evaluation of Education Quality in Management Science for Institutions of Higher Education”.

Terms & dates:

Semesters are each divided into 7-8 week modules.

- Summer: no courses available
- Fall: Module 1 runs early Sept through Oct, Module 2 runs Nov to mid-Dec
- Winter: modules do not align with UW calendar

Academics:

Exchange students take a minimum of 3 classes at SJTU in the Antai College of Economics and Management. Check with the UW MBA Program Office to determine your overseas course load.

Students take courses from the International MBA and Financial MBA course offerings.
