Students take MBA or MA: Commerce courses. Students must take minimum of 1 course and maximum of 10 courses. Areas of study include: Financial Management & Economics, Organizational Behavior & Human Resources Management, Strategic Management & Business Policy, Entrepreneurship, Marketing, Accounting & Corporate Finance, Technology Management, Process & Operations Management, Information Technology, and International Relations. Waseda's fall course schedule is updated in May.

Students may transfer up to 16 credits toward their UW MBA degree. Check with the UW MBA Program Office to determine your overseas course load.

Housing:

Incoming exchange students have an option of applying for a university's dormitory (Waseda Houshien). Room assignments are not guaranteed. Waseda Houshien is located near Shinjuku Station, a bustling part of Tokyo. More information can be found here: https://www.hoshien.or.jp/english/.
