

2025 MBA Global Consulting: India (IBUS 579)

Overview

A select group of MBA students will travel to India in March to apply their ingenuity and advanced strategy skills to projects with social entrepreneurial ventures. These are real world projects in an emerging economy context that will challenge the students to find creative solutions and gain practical experience that cannot be found in any textbook. In the process, they will help rural Indians build the kind of businesses that can lift their families and communities out of poverty. This is a real opportunity to make a difference in people's lives...and to get a first-hand look at social entrepreneurship and how it works.

The group will meet on one evening and two Saturdays during Winter Quarter. Teams will work with the client on the ground in India for nine days in March, then develop solutions in a required four-credit IBUS 579 class during Spring Quarter. Recommendations will be presented via Zoom in May 2025, with the client providing feedback.

SEWA

The Self-Employed Women's
Association (SEWA) represents 1.9
million self-employed Indian women,
most supporting families on less than
\$2 per day. SEWA organizes these
women into collective businesses and
helps them feed their families, educate
their children and improve the health
of their communities. This is a worldclass group that believes that business
is the answer to poverty. Former U.S.
Ambassador Melanne Verveer calls
them "a model for the world" in
providing livelihoods. We will be



working with SEWA's excellent staff – one Indian magazine has called them "power women" – in the group's headquarters in Ahmedabad as well as surrounding villages. More info: www.sewa.org

Schedule

The group will meet for <u>2 mandatory meetings during Winter Quarter 2025</u>, tentatively scheduled for Saturday, January 25 & Saturday, February 22. Students will leave from

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Seattle on Saturday, March 15, and begin the program Monday, March 17, arriving in Ahmedabad very early in the morning (India is 12.5 hours ahead of Seattle in March, so you will lose a day en route). The program includes a week of intense project work with SEWA. After final presentations to team's SEWA project managers on March 24, students have the option of either returning to Seattle on March 25, or participating in the optional sightseeing add-on to visit India's Golden Triangle (Jaipur, Agra, and Delhi). The add-on (\$1495 single occ./\$1095 double occ., paid directly to *Journey India Online*) will include flying from Ahmedabad to Jaipur and seeing the picturesque city palace, Amer Fort, and visiting textile markets. From Jaipur, the group will drive to Agra and see the Taj Mahal at sunset and Agra Fort. The excursion will conclude in Delhi, visiting the Qutab Minar, India Gate, Raj Ghat, and Old Delhi. The optional portion of the trip is not part of the UW program and will be managed by our tour provider, Sanjay Mishra of *Journey India Online*.

Spring Quarter Class

IBUS 579 will meet on six evenings in Spring Quarter 2025 to develop solutions and produce deliverables for SEWA. Final presentations will take place in early May, at which point the class ends. Students interested in the March program to India must take IBUS 579 during Spring Quarter (a 4-credit class).

Program Requirements

For full-time MBAs, this program counts as a practical (PRACT) experience and also meets one international perspective (INTL) requirement. For the <u>Global Business Program</u>

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<u>Certificate</u>, it can meet either the Experiential Opportunity requirement or the International Elective Courses requirement, but not both.

Students will select from a list of strategy projects that SEWA will provide Professor Gupta. Projects will be announced in January. Examples of past projects:

Application

To apply, you will need to complete <u>the application</u> by October 20. If selected, you will need to secure your spot in the program with a non-refundable \$500 deposit by November 6. The remainder of the fee (\$1800) is due by December 1, 2024. The optional add-on cost is paid directly to Journey India Online and due by December 1, 2024.
