# Academic Program Overview

Gain hands-on experience in what it takes to be a startup founder during this intensive one-week bootcamp at the University of Washington Foster School of Business. Working in teams, students will use design thinking to develop innovative product ideas, validate markets, create business strategies and build prototypes.

Inspired by UW Foster's undergraduate entrepreneurship curriculum, the program dives into the real-world challenges and energy of launching a startup. The week blends classroom learning with hands-on application and insights from Seattle's vibrant startup ecosystem.

Learn essential business fundamentals from UW Foster faculty and industry pros, then immediately put those concepts to work through prototyping, strategy sessions and team collaboration. The program wraps with a pitch competition where you'll present your startup idea to a panel of judges, followed by an awards and certificate ceremony to celebrate your progress.

Whether you're exploring entrepreneurship for the first time or building skills that help you stand out for college and beyond, this bootcamp gives you the experience and confidence to turn ideas into action.
