## Academic Program Overview

Are you a rising sophomore, junior, senior, or soon-to-be high school graduate in 2026 with a passion for business and leadership? The University of Washington Foster School of Business is partnering with Summer Springboard to host a transformative two-week experience designed to inspire the next generation of leaders. This program combines academic rigor, hands-on learning, and leadership development with exclusive access to Seattle's dynamic business network.

Students will develop critical skills in teamwork, communication, and problem-solving through interactive workshops, a case competition, and visits to leading corporations. In this program, students will gain valuable insights into the business world while learning directly from Foster School faculty in their state-of-the-art facilities, providing a firsthand experience of college life on UW's campus.



## Excursions

Students will visit top businesses and companies in the Seattle area during their excursions. These visits will provide students with the opportunity to apply what they are learning in class, including lectures and their case competition, to real-world settings. Previous excursions have included Microsoft and Starbucks.
